Minutes from the Annual Meeting of Members held on April 23, 2005 were unanimously approved as written and published in the Summer 2005 issue of the *Waybill*.

Reports

Bob Sherman, Treasurer, reported on Region finances. As of December 31, 2005 the General Fund and the Youth Fund had combined net assets of \$27,913.39. For the year then ended revenues, primarily from dues, were \$6,664.05; expenses, primarily for the *Waybill*, were \$9,156.23 and net expenses were \$2,492.18. Expenses exceeded revenues because two mailings to all members were necessary in 2005. Only one mailing to all members is expected in 2006 and the format of the *Waybill* will change to further reduce costs.


The Board of Directors have passed along a cost cutting decision to enable the Region to save money on printing costs.

Modeling Hands On

Spruce up your Caboose!

More Details:


To add more detail remove the factory installed coupler and replace it with a Kadee #58 prototypical sized coupler. The screw for the coupler box can be stripped easily so be careful with removing the coupler cover for the first time. Place the Kadee #58 and spring into the coupler box and replace the cover and screw. I generally install a proto coupler on the lead locomotive front and the caboose rear for esthetics.

For a dash more detail you can cut the hose off the coupler and install a Detail Associates detailed brake line. I drilled a #00 hole with a pin vice to the right of the coupler and used CA to secure the hose.

Paint the brake valve and end silver, with the hose grimy black. I also dry brushed the coupler Poly Scale Roof Brown to give it a rusty look.

Conclusion:

After a few quick steps you can achieve a nicer looking model. I only added ten individual parts to the caboose and it really looks great. Give it a try.

2007 Election

Petition Deadline Is August 17

Although the 2007 election is several months away, it is time to start the election cycle. In 2007 we will elect a President, a Vice-President and three (3) Directors-at-Large.

Gary Children and Randy Williamson will complete their first two-year term as President and Vice-President, respectively. They will be eligible to run for another term in 2007.

Barb Rothwell from the South Central Wisconsin Division, one of the three incumbent DALs, will complete her second two-year term in 2007 and under the Bylaws will not be eligible to run for another term in 2007. Our thanks to Barb for her dedicated service.

Lynn Jasch from the Winnebago Division and Bill Litkenhous from the Central Indiana Division will complete their first two-year term in 2007 and will be eligible to run for another term in 2007.

There are two ways that your name can be placed on the ballot.

The first is by recommendation of the Nominating Committee and approval of the Board of Directors. To be considered by the Nominating Committee

(Chairman Jim Wilhite from the Central Indiana Division and Members Reid Kahrs from the Wisconsin Southeastern Division and Jim Spice from the North Shore & Western Division), you must submit a biography/ candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo to the Committee with a copy to the Region Secretary (Bert Lattan) as soon as possible, but no later than August 17, 2006.

The preferred method of delivery is electronic mail. (While e-mail is not required to serve on the Board, it is highly desirable since the Board conducts pre and post meeting activity by e-mail.) If you do not have e-mail, you may mail your bio/photo to Bert Lattan, who will convert it to an electronic format and send it to the Committee. Addresses and e-mail addresses for the Committee and the Secretary are on the Region website.

The second method is by petition signed by at least ten (10) current, resident NMRA members. The petition form is available on the Region website or it may be requested from Bert Lattan. Your petition must be accompanied by a biography/candidate's statement of 200 words or less and a 2x2, passport-style photo. It must be received, by Bert Lattan, no later than August 17, 2006. He will convert it to electronic format and forward it to the Committee.

The Committee will submit its recommendations and the names of all resident members nominated by petition to the Board of Directors for review and approval during its next meeting, which will be held on October 1, 2006 in Rockford, Illinois at the Midway Village Museum.

Each candidate's biography/statement & photo and a ballot will be included in the Winter 2006 issue of the *Waybill*. The results of the election will be announced during the 2007 Annual Meeting of Members, which will be held on April 21 during the 2007 Spring Convention in Muncie, Indiana.


