JOHN TESCH MEMORIAL AWARD

At the Fall Region Convention in the Quad Cities the first annual John Tesch Memorial Award will be given. The award will honor the memory of the late John Tesch who gave many hours of time to the hobby, to the MWR Region and the Fox Valley Division. His N gauge layout was one of the finest.

The criteria for the award is as follows:

- * The award will be made for the most innovative "N" scale diorama or model.
- * The modeler must be an NMRA member and is or has been actively involved in the NMRA organization at any level: e.g. officer, helper at functions, judge, showing or participating at shows, etc. This will be determined by the Contest Chairman.

The first award at the Quad Cities Convention will be made by Mrs. Peggy Tesch. The award will be presented at each Fall MWR Region Convention thereafter.

NEW STAMP ISSUE TO COMMEMORATE RAILROAD UNION PIONEER

(Condensed from an article in the Chicago Sun Times.) A 25-cent Black Heritage stamp will be released in New York City Feb. 3rd. honoring A. Philip Randolph, for years the most prominent, respected and indefatigable voice for the rights of minority labor.

The stamp will be of large commemorative size vertically arranged, dominated by a head and shoulder portrait of Randolph, with a smaller image of a train of Pullman cars and three sleeping car porters superimposed on the lower part of the design.

Randolph won his 12 year campaign to organize the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters in 1937 with the first contract ever signed between a white employer and a black labor leader. In the next decade the brotherhood was America's preeminent black political institution with Randolph its eloquent spokesman.





I hope that in this new year that you and your family will prosper and so will your modeling. See you at Madison this May and don't forget to vote.



Many of you have familt members, neighbors and friends that are presently serving our youth as Scoutmasters or Cubmasters, Girl Scout or Brownie leaders, camp conselors and advisors in scouting and other organizations. Now is the time for model railroads of the Midwest Region to stand and be recognized. Better yet, sit and write a short note to me if you are interested in becoming a division coordinator and/or merit badge counselor. At this writing date (Nov. 13, 1991) we need a division coordinator for each division except for South Central Wisconsin Division. We need local counselors throughout each division for close proximity and availability to work directly with the scouts. This can be a very gratifying experience and also rewarding because you will earn points toward your association volunteer certificate, relative to the time and effort involved. Position duties and point awards as follows:

Division Coordinator - 1 point per month.

- a. Establish counselor listing for division and keep up to date with monthly additions and deletions.
- Verify counselor points and forward to region coordinator for records.

Counselor - 1 point per month and 2 points per scout certification.

- a. Certify scouts for merit badge.
- Report certification to local scout office and division coordinator.

The following is taken from the Boy Scouts of America Merit Badge Counseling pamphlet. "Your job is to satisfy yourself that each scout who comes to you meets all the requirements for the merit badge. In this sense you are an examiner. But, your larger oppurtunity lies in couching helping the scout over the different hurdles of the requirements and making him aware of the deeper aspects of the subject from your knowledge and experience."

Now, that doesn't sound too difficult does it? Believe me, it is neither difficult nor excessively time consuming.
